CWC 2018: The ride is on!

Dear friends,

Good news: **CWC 2018 is on!** While the sign up rate for the previous rides was very fast, the sign up rate for the 2018 ride was and still is very slow. For some time I was worried that we may even have to cancel the ride in 2018, which would have been very disappointing for me and the other signed up riders, but more importantly it would also been very sad for the children under the care of our beneficiary, Effective Aid International.

Fortunately we have now with 15 riders enough people signed up or verbally committed to start the ride. There are another five/six people considering and I am rather optimistic that some of them will still come true before the booking deadline ends on December 10. And this would mean, we would end up with a similar number of riders as last year, which was perfect. Quality always trumps quantity!

I spent a lot of time trying to analyse, why the booking this year is so slow, when in the previous years it was so fast to get to higher numbers. There are a number of reasons. Job changes and other professional and personal challenges are certainly a big reason. And we can't assume that the same people will be willing to join the ride very year. It is a significant sacrifice - both in precious vacation time as well as financially. Many I spoke to mentioned that they would like to join the ride again in 2019. This means, we will have no problem filling the ranks in 2019. However, we also do not want to have the problem of slow sign up again in 2020 and hence it is so important to introduce new members into the CWC family, as we have done for the next ride with four first timers already booked for CWC 2018. CWC 2018: The Ride!

Day 1, January 27th: Bangkok – Khao Yai

The ride will start after leaving Bangkok with a bus transfer to Chachoengsao. From there we will visit the 100 year market where we start our bike journey into the countryside of Nakhon Nayok.

Ride : 85 km.

Day 2, January 28th : Khao Yai – Muak Lek

After breakfast we will ride to the Muak Lek district of the Saraburi province. the ride will lead through scenic valleys surrounded by the shadow of Khao Yai, the big mountain.

Day 3, Mon, 29 Jan 2018 : Muak Lek – Pasak

Today, we head northwest toward Pasak. The Pasak river runs through 3 major provinces and is an important water supply for agriculture. Pa Sak Cholasit Dam was built to alleviate the drought in the lower valley regions.

Ride : 100 km.

From Pasak we ride to the quiet province of Nakhon Sawan where the Ping and Nan rivers meet the mighty Chao Phraya river.

We ride through rice paddies. Look out for water buffaloes wallowing in a puddle and for ducks taking a dip in the rice field. This is an area of Thailand not visited by many tourists, so you will pique the interest of locals!

Cyclists With Compassion (CWC) is a group of like-minded cycling enthusiasts and was started with the goal to make a difference to underprivileged children in Asia by raising money for better education, which in turn will bring hope for a better, brighter future. CWC plans and organises long-distance cycling tours to parts of Asia, raising awareness about the needs of children in these areas. The Baan Fah Sighy Children Home is supported by Effective Aid International (EAI), our chosen beneficiary of the ride.

For over 15 years EAI (www.effectiveaid.org) has been changing the future for displaced, orphaned and abandoned children both in Northern Thailand and Myanmar. For EAI quality education is the single most effective weapon that can be used today, to erase poverty in the future - so education is their key focus. During these past years, EAI has provided more than 13,000 individual years of schooling to children in refugee camps, displaced peoples' villages and children's homes. EAI has employed, trained and empowered hundreds of refugees as teachers in their schools and have provided love, food, safety and shelter to abandoned and orphaned children. Our ambitious plans can only become reality with the help and support from private and corporate sponsors and I would like to ask your kind support by becoming a sponsor of the CWC ride 2018.
